# Muse Awards

The Muse Awards honor individuals and organizations for their contributions to arts and culture throughout Palm Beach County. In 2016, Educational Gallery Group was awarded our second Muse Award in the category of Outstanding Arts & Cultural Organization.

This was a great honor for our organization and we hope to continue to contribute outstanding programs and events to our community.



## Our Gallery

In 2016 Eg2 Showcased the Regional Scholastic Gold and Silver Awarded works at the Armory Art Center in West Palm Beach. Our organization also displayed an exhibition of alumni work at our temporary gallery space, 3300 S. Dixie Highway, during our Summer and Fall Academy Classes.

We have finally settled into a permanent gallery space and are excited to have a wide variety of exhibitions during 2017.



## Outreach

Outreach is a pillar of Eg2 - as an organization we are constantly turning to our community for events and programs to partner with.

In 2016 we were very proud to be a part of the first Palm Beach Mini Maker Faire, held by the South Florida Science Center and Aquarium. During the event we provided lessons on creating texture with lines and gave free "I'm an artist at Eg2" t-shirts for the younger kids to decorate. Both activities were geared toward helping kids explore their creativity and allowed them a chance for personal expression.





## Vocational Skills Training



At the end of 2015, Eg2 was provided with a grant allowing us to introduce an after-school Sewing Program provided to students attending the Marjorie S. Fisher Boys and Girls Club. This program focused on vocational training for under privileged youth and our organization was able to provide sewing machines, materials and instructors free of charge to all participants.



## Macy's Art Wall



The photo display featured on the East wall of Macy's in City Place featured 10 select student works from the 2016 Regional Scholastic Art Awards that were printed and installed by our organization. The artwork includes photos, paintings, and digital art chosen from high school and middle school honorable mention, silver and gold awarded works. Every year we hold a small opening ceremony where we honor the students and reveal the new works.



## Catwalk



Catwalk is a unique event offered by Eg2 in which we hold a free series of workshops that lead up to a full-fledged runway show for students in grades 3 and up. In 2016 we had around 30 participants. Eg2 partnered with Resource Depot, who provided supplies, and Harbourside Place who donated a store front for our workshops and hosted our runway show at their Veggies and Vogue Event. During our workshops, we were able to provide sewing machines and materials to every participant, for the first time.

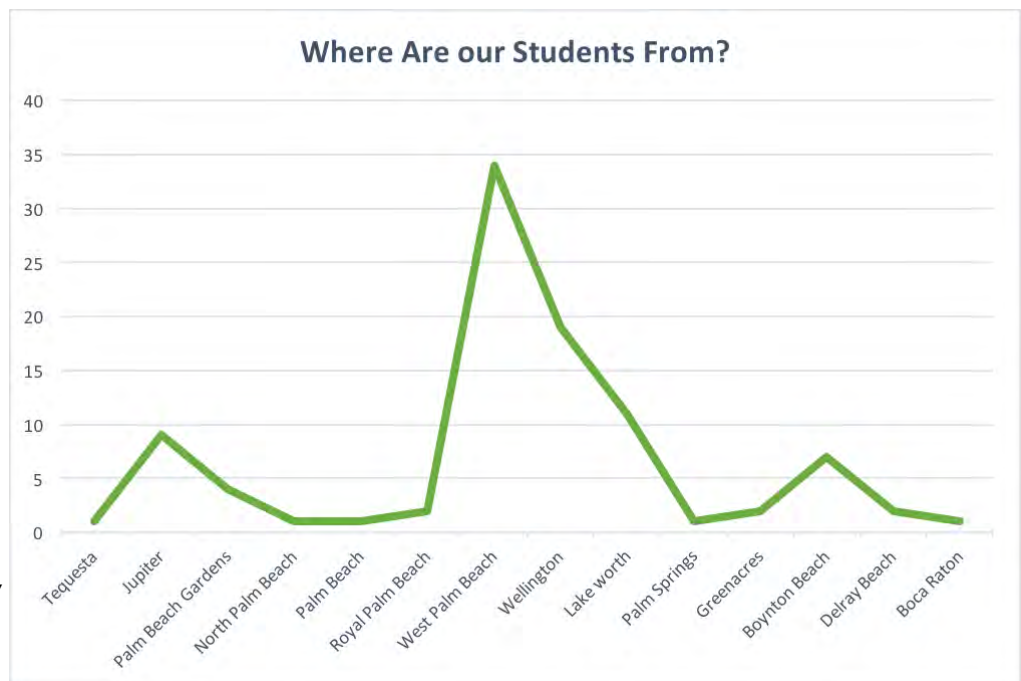


# The Academy

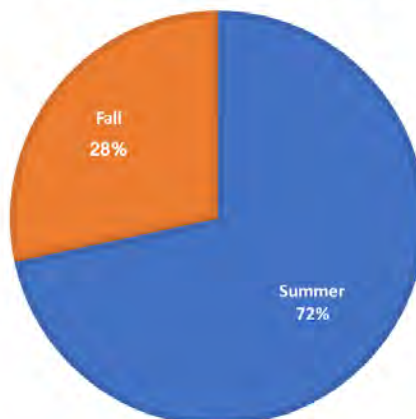

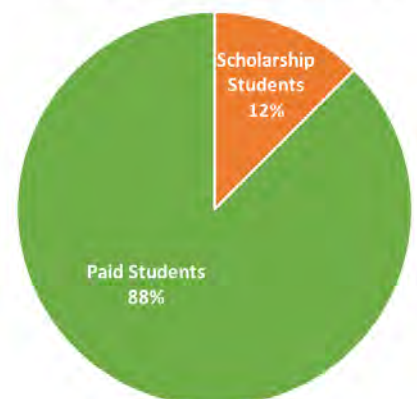

# Scholastic Art Awards

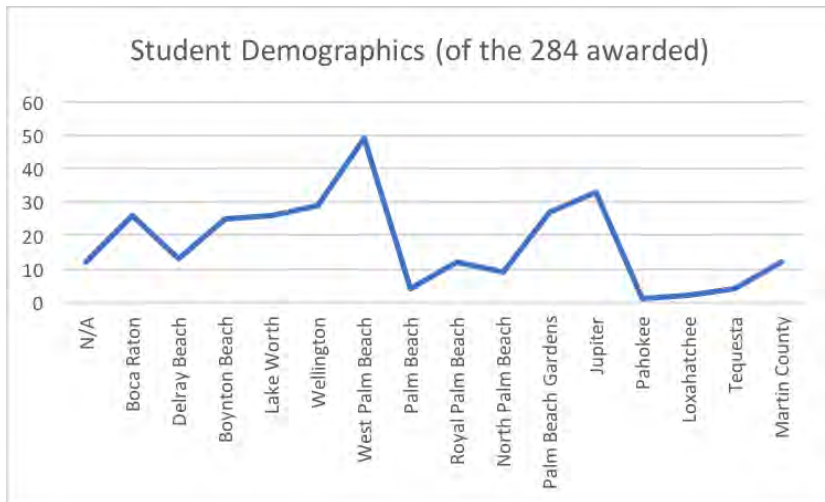
Around 25 different schools were represented during the awards and 56 educators. Our Judges include art educators, local artists, gallery owners and Scholastic Alumni.



Our region had 49 works awarded nationally including: 28 Silver Medals, 3 Silver Medals with Distinction, 17 Gold Medals and One American Vision Award. Our region had a National Portfolio winner who received a \$10,000 scholarship and was one of only ten chosen for this honor. The Palm Beach Region also had a student's photography piece chosen for the cover of the 2016 National Catalog and featured in the New York Times.

Hundreds of Family, Friends and Scholastic Participants attended our opening and awards ceremony at the Armory Art Center. Our Gallery was set up over the course of four days and it displayed around 500 works from Gold and Silver key winners.

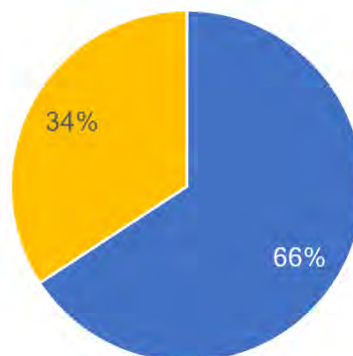

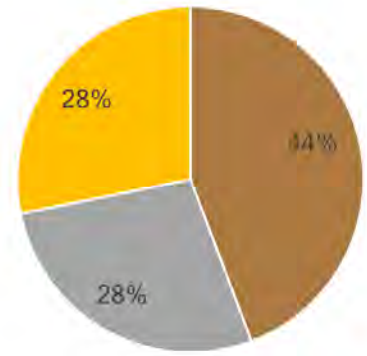
