Financial Assistance for Programs and Events

Financial Aid is available to all currently registered GSSEF girl members for up to \$30 per Girl Scout year.* Applying for Financial Aid is done in one simple step during the registration process—just select the box that reads “Apply for Financial Aid” under “Choose payment options” on the event registration page.

**Resident Camp Financial Aid is separate from other programming and is still available to girls that have used their \$30*

Requesting Financial Aid does not guarantee a spot in a program. Financial assistance allocations are subject to availability within the Council’s current annual budget.

Don't forget! Troop finance reports are due June 30

It's that special time of year again and just like taxes were due in April, your Troop Finance Reports are due June 30, 2023. This is a requirement detailed in the Volunteer Policies and Procedures and here's why it's important for each troop to submit a finance report:

- Doing so allows our council to reconcile finances in preparation for the annual audit.
- It's good to organize the troop finances after a busy year. Remember, parents may ask to see the status of troop finances at any time.
- It provides details of what troops are doing and how they are spending their funds. This helps us with planning future programs and events.

Where's the Troop Finance Report and how long will it take me to complete?

It is easy and convenient to complete the Troop Finance Report! The report is available 24/7 in your Volunteer Toolkit (VTK). To access your troop's VTK simply login to [MyGS](#), click the VTK tab, and then the FINANCE tab. Entries are saved as they are entered and you may leave the form and come back to it to finish at a later time—just be sure to submit your completed form by June 30!

What will I need to complete the Troop Finance Report?

In addition to reporting troop expenses and income (save those receipts throughout the year!) you will also need a saved bank statement, preferably the May or June 2023 statement. That's it! The form does all the calculations for you.

Bridging Basics: Planning Your Bridging Ceremony

Your Girl Scouts have worked hard all year, and they've earned a celebration!

Bridging is a beloved Girl Scout tradition that honors girls' achievements throughout the year and celebrates their "crossing the bridge" to the next Girl Scout level.

Bridging Basics:

Many troops hold their bridging ceremony in May or June, and some link it to the end of the girls' current school year. You may also choose to deepen your girls' connection with their Girl Scout sisters by holding your ceremony during National Bridging Week on June 12-19, 2023. Girl Scout bridging ceremonies have a few basic elements.

- Opening: Welcome your guests and share the Girl Scout Promise and Law.
- Main section: Girls, whether physically or symbolically, cross a bridge and are welcomed to the next Girl Scout level.
- Closing: Girls participate in a friendship circle and thank their guests.

Where should the ceremony be held?

They can be held at a school, a recreation center, a park, backyard, or a church event space.

Keep the ceremony girl-led.

Depending on your girls' ages, you might find yourself doing a good chunk of the

planning, however, as troop leader encourage the girls to plan the ceremony. They can choose any readings, poems, or songs that they want to say or sing. The girls cross the bridge and if they are bridging to the next level, they get their new uniform right there.

Get families and your community involved.

Share this important moment with your girls' caregivers and other family members, and anyone else the girls wish to invite! Maybe a favorite teacher, coach, or someone they volunteered with this year—and be sure to recognize these individuals at the ceremony.

Don't forget to ask for help when you need it.


In order to minimize costs and free up some of your time as troop leaders, request that parents sign up to bring certain food items and decorations. Troops may purchase things for bridging ceremonies like cake and pizzas—so be sure to ask for parent volunteers to pick up those items while you might be rehearsing the bridging ceremony with the troop.

Check in with your service unit.

You may want to ask your service unit if it hosts a unit-wide bridging ceremony or if there are other opportunities for your girls to connect with their Girl Scout sisters at this time of year.
